

On behalf of the Business Coalition for ILAB, a broad-based coalition of businesses and industry associations, we urge Congress to approve full funding for the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of International Labor Affairs (ILAB), as provided for in appropriations legislation reported out by the United States Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Maintaining ILAB's full funding and authority for both its programs and its grant-making is necessary so that this important work can continue.

The Coalition applauds the bi-partisan legislation produced by the Senate Committee that recognizes ILAB's important work by maintaining current levels of funding for ILAB in the fiscal year 2019 Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) Appropriations bill.
